Ira Forman, Houston Community-Wide Event January 16th

Ira Forman was sworn in as Special Envoy to Monitor and Combat Anti-Semitism (SEAS) on May 20, 2013. He leads the State Department's efforts to advocate on behalf of Jewish communities and through his travels, regularly articulates U.S. policy on monitoring and combating anti-Semitism throughout the world.

Prior to serving as SEAS Mr. Forman accumulated 40 years of experience in Jewish communal work and public service. From 2011-2012 Mr. Forman served as the Jewish Outreach Director for the Obama for America campaign. He served for nearly 15 years as the Executive Director of the National Jewish Democratic Council and spent four years with the American Israel Public Affairs Committee where he worked as Political Director and Legislative Liaison. He has also served on the boards of a number of Jewish non-profits.

Throughout his career he has spoken and written extensively on Jewish history and public policy. Mr. Forman co-edited and wrote for the reference book, *Jews In American Politics*.




AIPAC Policy Conference March 4th-6th




